ADVOCACY

Mary Lee Flannigan

Mary Lee has a long history of engaging, supporting, and advocating for WHPE members. Mary Lee has worked tirelessly to help generate funds through school-based fundraisers supported by our association. Marylee understands the key to creating health-related activities that support student learning, giving back to the school communities, and while assisting the teacher in creating healthy active classrooms. In her current role, as a Game-On representative, she has created partnerships for WHPE facilitating member fundraising to continue to support and sustain resource/equipment acquisition, as well as supporting the needs of the school community. Amid the COVID crisis, Mary Lee has worked with WHPE Treasurer, Katie Mulloy, to adapt and increase opportunities for needed fundraising using technology. According to WHPE Executive Director, Penny Kroening, 'Mary Lee has been a steadfast light of enthusiasm, reaching out to assist our teachers with a turn-key effort'. WHPE recognizes what Mary Lee has done, and we look forward to the future while working with such a quality advocate engaged jointly in promoting our Mission.

Milwaukee Public Schools Superintendent, Dr. Keith P. Posley/Milwaukee Board of School Directors

In April of 2020 Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) put forth a referendum to the City of Milwaukee which included increasing the number of physical education teachers within the district. On April 7, 2020 78% of voters supported the referendum. The funding for increasing staffing is being spread over three years. Starting in the 2020-2021 school year MPS has added or will add 11 positions for each of those school years. This will increase the number of PE teachers from 143 to 176 teachers by the 2022-2023 school year. This will mean that by the 2022-2023 school year every MPS school will have at least one full-time physical education teacher! In addition to staffing there has also been funding allocated for professional development, improvements to facilities and equipment for physical education.

All of this could not have been possible without the leadership of Dr. Keith P. Posley, Superintendent, and the Milwaukee Board of School Directors. They believe that this additional support will help the district eliminate disparities in educational opportunities, including physical education. This was the first time in 25 years that MPS had gone to referendum and the community showed up to increase support for the students of MPS, which includes an almost 25% increase in the number of physical education teachers in the district.

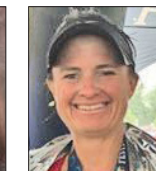

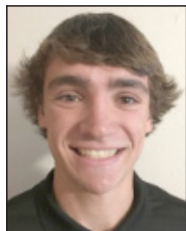
